During discussion about grass cutting invoices an issue was raised concerning removal of brambles on the perimeter of the playing field. The Clerk is to obtain a price for the work to be carried out.

#### c) Proposed reserves Allocation

A proposal was presented to the meeting in the form of a pie chart for discussion. Issues of funding a zip wire, 5 a side pitch, and ensuring risk assessment and insurance cover, were considered as an early day provision prior to the completion of the access path. Clerk to investigate costs. In addition realistic general reserves should be protected.

- e) As the second precept allocation was notified as being paid into the current account late on Monday it is not now necessary to transfer funds to cover the payment of the MVAS device.

#### **SC 109 22 MVAS**

The Parish Council has agreed to a single solar powered device for speed monitoring sited at the top of Main Street near Three Turns Lane junction. Clarification of the insurance cover required by Highways is needed as our insurers are unable to quantify the precise risk in this respect and thus agree cover.

#### SC 110 22 Play a Part Update

A meeting was held on 18<sup>th</sup> July with County Councillor, Parish Councillor, VCS representative from LCC, and a member of the Steering group. A wide-ranging discussion resulted in a vision for a longer-term objective to replace the existing children's play equipment with apparatus for play, exercise, and social purposes and to build a community space which includes use of the Village Hall facility. Alongside the work on a specification for the pathway coffee mornings/afternoons are planned to start as soon as possible.

#### SC 111 22 Kings Lane – Update

The current status of the application to alter footpath D53 was conveyed to the meeting from a communication provided by the Safe and Sustainable Travel Team at LCC. The latter have assured that Parish Council will be kept informed of the progress confirming that the Parish Council's objection to the change.

Also raised with this item was the removal of a hedge during works carried out on the land for which a pre removal photograph had been provided and sent to Planning Enforcement. They have undertaken to visit the site with their ecologist and report back.

#### SC 112 22 Police Report

No report was received from the police for the Parish area. However it was noted that there have been vehicle thefts in the wider rural area.

#### SC 113 22 Clerks Report

- \* SBA (Government Auditor) have acknowledged receipt of the exempt status for this year's audit and have indicated that no further action is needed unless they receive any correspondence from electors during the period for the exercise of electors rights this period ended on 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2022.
- \* The Clerk needs to spend c£30 on an additional computer health package from Norton Antivirus to rectify register anomalies. The software should speed up the computer functions. This was agreed by resolution proposed Cllr Newby, seconded by Cllr Goodger.
- \* LCC Highways following an email sent in July condemning their response to 3 times requested action since March 2022 an apology was made with a promise to take appropriate action. I subsequently learned that School Lane will not be repaired until completion of building works at number 39 due to HGV traffic using the road. The property owner has undertaken to advise us of the date as soon as possible.
- \* Recording of Councillors non-attendance at meetings must be by resolution advised by LRALC. This was implemented for this meeting.

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#### SC 115 22 Opportunity for Members of the Public to speak (Limited to 3 minutes)

#### Planning Application at Queniborough Lodge for construction of 125 net dwellings Application Ref P/22/1224/2

A Planning Application has been submitted to Charnwood as follows:

Demolition of the existing industrial buildings at 1448 Melton Road (former Shield Engineering), 1444 Melton Road (lodge cottage) and the northern-most 20th Century wing of 1446 Melton Road (Queniborough Lodge); conversion of Queniborough Lodge and associated outbuildings to form 8 no. dwellings and the construction of 119 no. new dwellings (125 net dwellings in total); new vehicular access onto Melton Road; open space including play provision and allotments and associated infrastructure, SuDS, landscaping and ground remodelling.

This site was allocated in the Queniborough Neighbourhood Plan as an allocated site for housing and well as being included the Charnwood Draft Local Plan. The development for housing was previously approved by Charnwood Borough Council but the permission has now lapsed. Recognising that it will be very difficult to oppose the principal

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of housing on this former brownfield site objections should focus on the effect of the development on local infrastructure such as doctors, roads, and schools.





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#### **Charnwood Local Plan Hearings to resume in October**

The inspectors conducting the examination of Charnwood Draft Local Plan have provided a further update.

The hearings were paused in July as the inspectors wanted interested parties to have an opportunity to comment on the evidence which underpins the apportionment of Leicester's unmet housing need.

This consultation, which is a focussed piece of work and aimed at those involved in the examination process, is now underway.

The inspectors have now confirmed examination hearings will resume in October and sessions will take place on October 25 and 26 to consider housing and employment needs.

The inspectors say there will then be a 'reflective pause' to enable them to reach a finding about the apportionment of the unmet need for both housing and employment, for the Council to respond as necessary and to enable any implications for the Plan to be properly considered.

Dates for future hearings after the October sessions have yet to be confirmed by the inspectors.

I was the only Charnwood Borough Councillor to oppose the Draft Local Plan going forward to the Planning Inspector as I felt too much housing development was focussed this side of Charnwood.
